

There will also be activities for the whole family to enjoy. The Russel Library, located in Middletown, hosts storytime for children and grown ups. The market also has a Kids' Tickets Program, where kids receive \$5 in paper market money where they can spend it on produce that they may have not ever tried. It also teaches them how to spend and use money. Christine Cicoria, Middletown Farmers Market Manager, says what makes the Middletown Farmer's Market stand out to others in the area is that "we have been able to serve a population of our community who have been affected by food insecurity." The market allows people who have SNAP benefits to buy goods there without feeling excluded.

Their hours are 12 to 9 p.m. from Monday to Friday, and 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. on the weekends.

Coming soon to Middletown is AL's Ice Cream Shoppe, settling next door to NoRA's Cupcakes on Main Street. Owned by the same company, AL's will be offering homemade, slow-churned ice cream. 

Great Options for Hiking and Biking Trails In The Area

Summer is here, and with it comes warm weather and a desire to go outside. Thankfully, there are plenty of hiking and biking trails across Connecticut that are perfect for getting out into nature.

Perhaps the most well-known is the Air Line Trail, stretching across the state and passing through Portland, East Hampton, Colchester, Hebron, Columbia, Lebanon, Windham, Chaplin, Hampton, Pomfret, Putnam, and Thompson. Once a railroad track that stretched from Boston to New York, it is now the perfect trail for hikers, bikers, and even horseback riders. Many of the sections from each town were separated from each other, and work continues to join them and create one long trail. In the meantime, there are various parking lots available for people to choose where they want to start and end, free to the public. It is praised for its beauty all along the trail and is a favored spot for people of all athletic hobbies.

In Middletown, one of the most beautiful outdoor spots is in Wadsworth Falls State Park. Not only are there various hiking trails for people to explore, there are also spots perfect for picnicking, swimming, and even a few beautiful waterfalls to enjoy. There are even locations that allow fishing in the Coginchaug River. Though there are parking fees for non-residents, the park is open year-round for visitors. It's also in the area of the Wadsworth Mansion, which holds various events throughout the year.

Also located in Middletown, the Scovill Loop Trails provide three different trails of varying lengths, no more than a mile long. The trails are described as wooded, but of mild terrain that are perfect for the whole family and more casual hikers. Various points along the trails give hikers gorgeous views of the Connecticut River and Hubbard Brook.

Wethersfield also has a few facilities available, including Mill Woods Park. Combination park and

trails, there are little league, softball, and soccer fields, a skate park, a bocce ball court, a tennis court, a skate park, a dog park, and numerous low-stress walking trails that are pet and family friendly. There are even picnic areas and a fishing pond perfect for all-day excursions.


Along with Mill Woods Park, there is also Wilkus Farm, protected in 2010 as by the town for farming and recreational activities, like hiking. The purchase of the area by the town allows its hayfields to be preserved, protecting the wildlife species that depend on it, as well as allowing agricultural activities to continue. A recent movement in 2020 instigated the installation of bike racks and benches for those intending to explore Wethersfield, so navigating the various trails and parks should be much more cyclist-friendly.

including quite a few scattered across Connecticut. Each branch is proclaimed to be "individually owned and operated," giving each one a local and personal feel. Their products are made fresh every day, with uneaten products being disposed of 36 hours after being made. Their flavors, as a result, are rotated daily. They also offer catering options for parties.

They are open daily from 11:30 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Newington's ice cream claim-to-fame is Mortensen's, a shop passed down through a family's generations that offers homemade ice cream. It has been located on the Berlin Turnpike for decades and is open year-round to serve over 50 delicious flavors. Not every flavor is always available, but an approximate list of their selections are available on their website. They also make their own ice cream pies and sandwiches.

Their hours are 11 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. from Sunday to Thursday, and 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Friday and

Saturday.

Last, but certainly not least, Cromwell has a couple of shops to offer. First is Cromwell Creamery, located on Willowbrook Road. While they don't have a website other than their Facebook page, there are several reviews scattered around the Internet to give an idea of what to expect. As told by these faithful reviewers, the ice cream is boasted to be either homemade or sourced from nearby areas. The portions are rather large, so be prepared if you decide to visit.

They are open daily from 11:45 a.m. to 9:30 p.m.

Also in Cromwell is Tall Man's Homemade Ice Cream. Located on Main Street, Tall Man's offers high-quality homemade ice cream, with options available for online orders and a delivery truck. Their prices and sizes are listed on their website, though the specific flavors aren't listed. Pictures of the staff give it a hometown, personal feeling.

They're open from 1 p.m. - 8 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday and are closed on Monday.

enthusiast.

In Cromwell, River Highlands State Park provides camping grounds, plenty of woods, and a spectacular view of the Connecticut River via its bluffs. It's a bit tougher of a hike than most of the aforementioned locations, with steep climbing necessary to reach said bluffs, but the hike is well worth it when the beautiful view of the river is revealed. There are many different trails to explore, with quite a few wooden bridges passing over little streams. At the water's edge, a unique feature colloquially known as "the blowhole" allows hikers to hear the wind whistle through the bluffs. It is a popular place to camp and also go birding, and while the explo-

ration of the trails is free, the camping requires a

small fee. Regardless, it is a must-see for any hiking

Newington also has its fair share of parks and trails, one of which is Churchill Park. There are various sport courts for bocce ball, volleyball, basketball, and tennis, as well as a playground, a fishing pond, and various fields. The trails sound relatively smooth to walk, and many bird enthusiasts enjoy going there in hopes of spotting some feathered friends.


Many of the Newington trails are through suburban areas that connect the offered parks to one another, but the town does publish a hiking guide. Another trail they offer is the Robert Stanley Nature Trail. This trail goes through woods and even over a swamp, though it appears to be a well-maintained trail that connects to Churchill Park. It's a short little hike, with a rather treacherous wooden bridge, but it's worth traversing if only to then explore Churchill Park.

Last, though certainly not least, there are quite a few trails to be found in Rocky Hill, one being Quarry Park. What used to be a quarry (hence the name) has now been repurposed into a park with a three-mile trail that offers casual hiking and bird-watching opportunities. It has a very fascinating history, so if historic locations are appealing, it's well-worth looking it up online before visiting it yourself. There are three available trails to hike, with only one providing a momentary steep incline. There are plenty

of maps, and the trails are well-blazed, to ensure that no one gets too utterly lost. A few nice little overlook spots display the nearby scenery and a few small ponds, with benches for convenience.

Dividend Pond Trails also provide some mild hiking opportunities, with attached archaeological sites that have spanned 1667 to the 1900s. There are three miles of trails but 68 acres that comprise the park and sites, so there's plenty to explore and discover. In addition to the hiking trails, there are, as the name suggests, various ponds and falls to take pictures of.

With summer bringing more opportunities to get outside and enjoy nature, there's no better place to start than some parks and hiking trails that provide something for the whole family. Pack up a lunch, get in the car, and make some extraordinary memories this summer.

"Kids who love to play pretend will love Kidcity,"

she says.

Among the themed rooms, there are also dress-up,

fake cars for children to drive, and props such as a boat in the fishing room and a flying saucer in the Route 66 room to take many photos.

If a child (or even adult) feels overwhelmed, Kidc-

ity offers rooms dedicated to calming down called quiet spots where children and adults can recharge their "emotional batteries" and "get your energy back before they play."

These rooms have less overstimulated toys and ac-

tivities and offers quieter activities such as reading and soft music, as well as nooks where children can "hide" in. In the basement, there is a room dedicated to children two and under, called The Sea Cave, where there a more of a bonding theme dedicated to guardians and their little ones with fewer handson activities compared to the rooms for other children.

Despite not having any special events or typical items such as jungle gyms or ball pits, Kidcity is a place for kids, and where "you come when you want and play".


Reservations are required to attend Kid City. To

Ferry Grill and Chill: A Quaint, Waterfront Place With Delicious Food





is also a kid's menu filled with food that children will love.


What makes this place stand out, according to Bezedelov, is that it is located along the historic Rocky Hill/Glastonbury Ferry, which

A Rocky Hill Farmstand With Fun For All

Located at 1146 Cromwell Ave. in Rocky Hill, Fair Weather Gardens is more than your average farmstand. Founded in 1988, the farmstand uses over 400 acres in Rocky Hill, Wethersfield, Berlin, Middletown Cromwell and Portland to bring all-natural, fresh fruits and vegetables to people's tables. People can sign up for the CSA, or the Community Supported Agriculture. For a fee between \$250 and \$650, depending on what plan one chooses, they can get fresh vegetables, fruits and other seasonal produce each week for 16 weeks. The money spent is used to help the farmers, the labor, and to buy seeds to grow crops.

The farmstand also has more to offer. Enjoy daily farm-to-table style breakfasts and lunches with meals such as avocado toast for breakfast, or a tuna melt for lunch that the whole family will love. There is also a soup of the day. Breakfast is served from 8 to 11 a.m., whereas lunch is served 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

In the fall, the farm holds its fall festival from mid-September to the end of October, which is most famous for its corn maze and arrangement of pumpkins to purchase. In the winter, they have their Winter Wonderland, where families can meet Santa. Christmas trees can also be purchased around this time.

The farmstand is open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. from late April to mid-December. They also do not do farmer's markets, however, they do sell their products to other people that may end up being used at markets.
