



Rocky Hill Superintendent Presents Proposed Budget

by Mark DiPaola

Rising personnel costs are driving a Superintendent-proposed \$2.1 million school spending increase, with the Rocky Hill district looking to accommodate a growing special education student population.

District Superintendent Dr. Mark Zito presented the tentative budget - representing a near-4.5 percent hike over the current \$48.2 million in school expenditures – to the Board of Education (BOE) last Thursday, to kick off a round of workshops that will inform their deliberations over coming weeks.

"As I've always said, education is a people-intensive industry," the Superintendent said. "That's consistent across every district - not just in Connecticut, but the country."

And with special education enrollment up - even though the district's overall student population, for the first time in years, appears to be stabilizing - Zito and his team are hoping to bring on more people to meet the demand for services.

Today, almost 15 percent of Rocky Hill students utilize special education services up from 9 percent a decade ago.

'That's a significant increase in kids with unique needs," Zito said. "Ten years ago, we had 230 kids in special education. Today, we have 377 kids."

And that doesn't include the 180 students with 504 plans, he said.

"I think part of the reason is we have great programming, and we have a reputation as a town that embraces kids with unique challenges," Zito said.

So Zito's proposed budget adds a special education teacher, as well as a paraeducator at over \$61,000 in collective staff costs.

The Superintendent's \$1.9 million in new position requests - 3.9 percent of the proposed budget increase - include a Grade 6 World Language teacher that would allow the district to continue the French and Spanish curriculum enhancements they initiated in the fifth-grade last year.

We want to make sure we continue with robust foreign language instruction at the 6th grade level," Zito said.

The proposed expenditures for new staffing includes \$18,000 for building substitutes – teachers and paraprofessionals.

While the pandemic-driven demand for substitutes will be a passing phenomenon, the rate – up from \$90 to \$150 per day - is likely the new norm, Zito said.

Rocky Hill Public Schools made the ad-

justment in lockstep with other districts, he

"If we didn't meet that rate, we'd be frozen out of the market," Zito said.

Even with costs going up, Rocky Hill

remains at the top of its District Reference Group (D) in SAT scores and at the bottom in expenditures - special education and oth-

Rocky Hill's special education costs take up 19 percent of its overall budget - the lowest in District Reference Group D.

The district is still \$5.5 million under the Reference Group average for overall expenditures - and \$9.9 million when compared to the State.

"We're certainly not overspending on education in Rocky Hill," Zito told the Board. "We're getting topflight education at a cost that's below average."

Town of Cromwell Remembers Michael Camilleri

Cromwell residents mourned and memorialized the late former school board chair Michael Camilleri, a week after his sudden passing sent shock waves through the community that he served for over a de-

Camilleri, an attorney and Republican who served on the Board of Education (BOE) for 12 years, lost his battle with neuroendocrine cancer on January 13, at 49

"It was just a shock," said Cromwell Mayor Allan Spotts, a longtime friend and former Republican Town Committee (RTC) Chair. "Mike was a dear friend to all of us and the entire Cromwell community. Our hearts go out to his wife, Terri, as well as his daughters, Megan and Jessica. He was a strong individual, but someone you could always go to for help. He's gonna be sorely

Former Mayor Enzo Faienza met Camilleri in 2008, not long after starting his own tenure at the RTC helm. He described the former Board chair as a close friend, confidant, and when everyone needed it, "the peacemaker" and "great negotiator".

"He's like a brother to me. We had so many great conversations, even in my personal life - he was just a great human being and a man of ethics and integrity," Faienza

said. "We're both Italian, so we can both get passionate about what we're doing, but he was the type of person who would help you to take a step back and analyze - not let the emotions take over."

Camilleri faced a particularly tough negotiation in 2020, when he called up former BOE member Jeff Matrullo to announce that he was stepping away to spend more time with his family – and that he was passing the gavel to the young attorney he's mentored since his days at Brown Rudnick.

but he mentored me and countless others, knowing it would make the entire organization better."

Town residents say that it was Camilleri's investment in Cromwell - through service on various local boards and commissions - that underscored his commitment to making his community better.

"Mike was just a giant in the community," said Town Councilor James Demetriades. "There isn't a single person in town with a bad thing to say about him. It's a huge loss."

Christie Carpino says Camilleri was

one of the first people she met when she first got involved in the community - for the current Cromwell State House Rep, it must have left an impression. "I remember how welcoming and open

and easy to talk to he was. I was fortunate to be able to count him as a friend for as long as I did," Carpino said. "Cromwell is a better place because of Mike. Mike loved his community and his family, and I'll miss him."

John Flanders first met Camilleri at UConn Law School - perhaps fittingly, the two took the same municipal law class.

Later, they would serve together on the School Board. And while the two would have their share of disagreements, Flanders says he was often wowed by Camilleri's knack for diplomacy.

"He definitely didn't allow party affiliation to impact anything. He was scrupulous

about that and entirely open to listening to anybody and giving real consideration to their thoughts," Flanders said. "Heaven knows he and I didn't agree on everything, but I always had the sense he respected my opinion."

Camilleri exemplified the school district governing body's apolitical, bipartisan spirit, says current Board Chair Celina

"Mike had a way of making everyone feel valuable and comfortable. He taught people to advocate for what they believed in and guided them through," Kelleher said. "What made him such a great leader was in part due to his ability to see both sides of an issue and express his opinion while respecting and inviting opposing viewpoints. I think he believed this made for some of the most important discussions."

She too described him as a trusted men-

"His words of encouragement have alwavs meant so much to me, and he always believed in me," she said. "I was happy to take on extra responsibilities if he was the one asking. I would definitely not have had the courage to take on the position of Board Chair if he had not taken me under his wing."

Human Services Hosts Youth Mental Health Forum

As a veteran youth case manager, Ann McAdams has seen a lot, but what she's seeing lately jarring even for her: teen clients pushing their parents to enroll them in mental health services – instead of the other way around.

"Which is a really big shift," says Mc-Adams, who works for Newington's Human Service Department. "The kids are now asking – begging – for therapy."

If there's a silver lining in the indication that today's youth are more aware of their social/emotional needs, it's also a loud and clear signal that everyone else had better catch up – and quickly, Connecticut health professionals said during a Facebook Live youth mental health forum hosted by State Representatives Gary Turco and Amy Bello.

"We've had a significant mental health crisis even prior to the pandemic," says Dr. Melissa Santos, who heads Division of Child Psychology at Connecticut Children's Hospital. "Since the start of the pandemic, we've seen a sharp increase across our entire system, with families trying to access our behavioral health services."

Even before the onset of COVID, suicide was the second leading cause of death among those between the ages of 10 and 34, according to the CDC.

Today, in the wake of job losses, learning disruptions, isolation, and cancelled school events, students are trying to reclaim some semblance of normalcy – even as the pandemic's emotional toll lingers, Santos and McAdams say.

Research has shown dramatic upsurges in reported anxiety and depression across all age groups, but healthcare professionals are particularly concerned about youth – 150,000 of which lost a parent or guardian to COVID.

"Even when the pandemic is gone, we're going to see kids impacted for a long time,"

Santos says.

Last year, state lawmakers passed Public Act 21-116, which requires schools, hospitals, and other community touchpoints to disseminate information regarding available mental health support services.

Other legislation ramped up youth suicide prevention training programs, added social emotional learning (SEL) to teacher professional development, and expanded outpatient services.

But gaps remain, lawmakers and mental health professionals say.

"We are seeing a lot of people struggling in our communities," Bello said. "The mental health needs have grown during the pandemic, and it's been hard to find services."

McAdams sees it firsthand. Newington Human Services has roughly 10 clients – all under the age of 14 and referred to her office by the Newington school system.

"We're seeing a lot of depression, anxiety, and it's like they just don't know how to

deal with it," she says. "It's heart-wrenching."

She recounted calling for a psych evaluation on behalf of one child – and being told the wait was 3-6 weeks. And that's on the low end – McAdams says 4-6-month delays are not uncommon.

"That's horrendous. A lot can happen in 4-6 months."

Turco and Bello will have 4 months to pump additional support into state and community resources – starting in February, when they return to Hartford to begin the winter legislative session.

Turco is promising a "comprehensive bill" – among his Democratic caucus's major priorities.

"We know a lot of parents and families are concerned about this," Turco said. "It's an issue that's been affecting people since before the pandemic, which has compounded and complicated this further."

Two Redistricting Options Presented to Town Council

A pair of new redistricting options minimizes or avoids the loss of polling stations while redistributing voter volume between them – the Newington Registrars' response to a groundswell of opposition following a previous proposal to go from 7 locations to 3

Newington registrars Theresa Avey (R) and Marie Fox (D) presented both at the Town Council's January 25 meeting. The Council plans to deliberate on February 8, pick one, and then schedule a public hearing – tentatively for February 22 – before making a final decision.

"We can't leave it as is, completely, because there have to be some changes that need to take place to realign it with the newly reapportioned districts," said Mayor Beth DelBuono, referring the Census-driven, legislative redistricting process that prompted the registrars' local-level analysis. "We can make those changes minimal, if that's what the public wants."

Newington currently has polling stations at:

•the Mortensen Community Center on Garfield Street (District 1)

•Ruth L. Chaffee School, at 160 Superior Avenue (District 2)

•Anna M. Reynolds School on 85 Reservoir Road (District 3)

•Elizabeth Green School on Thomas Street (District 4)

 John Wallace Middle School on Halleran Drive (District 5 and 8)

•John Paterson School at 100 Church Street (District 6)

•Martin Kellogg Middle School at 155 Harding Street (District 7)

Due to the legislative reapportionment, Newington loses its 29th House District, as well as a slice of its 27th – leaving what's left of the 27th and a portion of West Hartford's 20th District.

The original registrar proposal was to dedicate two polling stations (Mortensen Community Center and Ruth Chaffee Elementary) to the 27th, and one (John Wallace Middle School) to the 20th.

Revised plans would keep Reynolds, Chaffee, and Martin Kellogg untouched, while attempting to balance the distribution of voters among the other sites.

Option 1 is to:

•Combine District 8's 1,619 voters with District 5's 1,790 at a District 5 John Paterson Elementary School polling location (total: 3,409)

•Merge 919 District 5 voters, 830 District 1 voters, and 2,671 District 6 voters to the 20th Assembly District's John Wallace District 6 voting station (Total: 4,420)

•Redistribute voters between District 1 and District 2, with Robbins Avenue as the dividing line – result would be a District 2 reduction from 4,602 to 4,141, and a District 1 total of 2,851

•District 7 (2,428 voters), District 3 (2,050 voters), and District 4 (2,439 voters) would remain unchanged

Option 2 would:

• Roll District 4 and 7 into one voting location – tentatively Newington High School (NHS) – for a total of 4,867 voters

• Retain locations for Districts 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6

"I want to thank both of you for your hard work and response to feedback from Council and the public," said Councilor Mitch Page, who was in staunch opposition to the 3-location plan. "I could definitely support a change to an extent that it's responding to the reapportionment and maintaining our polling places."

Councilors say they were flooded with comments – email and otherwise – in the two weeks following the first proposal, which critics say would have had the effect of making it more difficult to vote by increasing driving distances to the polls and causing long lines and delays.

But Fox and Avey have maintained that that was never the intent.

"We would like to thank the public that reached out, not only with their concerns, but their ideas," Avey said. "We've looked at many options since our first presentation."

"We're here to make it easier for voters – not suppress them," Fox added.

But they've also described a balancing act between keeping polling stations open and keeping them staffed – Avey says it takes more than a hundred workers to run all the town's location during a typical election, and that yearly recruiting challenges were a large factor in their calculus.

That much is unlikely to change if the Council goes with either of the two new options, but local officials say they're willing to help.

"As a 24-year resident and now an elected official, I take my vote incredibly seriously to a point where I take the day off from work not only to vote, but stand at the polls," said Board of Education member Jessica Weaver during the January 25 public comment segment.

Now, she's recruiting younger residents to work at the polls.

"I think it's important that we don't put the onus on our senior citizens, so by the public hearing, I will have a bunch of young people who will have undersigned to commit to being poll workers this next election," she said. "Rest assured, that will no longer be an issue."

Town resident Gia Pascarelli admitted that she had some reservations about the proposed NHS location in Option 2 – Fox and Avey said they chose the high school because it would offer more parking.

"Plenty of parking sounds great, but Willard Ave heading into Cedar Street is a bit of a nightmare when it comes to traffic," Pascarelli said

Town resident Jan Kritzman says she's concerned that coming apartment developments – and an influx of new residents to town – will make even a modest reduction in polling locations less than tenable.

"A lot of them may, hopefully, register to vote," Kritzman said. "I'm glad the proposal isn't to reduce it to 3 anymore, but even 6 might not work, because you have to prepare for the possibility of more people."

Mayor DelBuono and the Council thanked residents for weighing in – but they say the voter suppression allegations leave a bitter taste.

"Their testimony convinced me that three was way too drastic," said Deputy Mayor Gail Budrejko. "Their concerns were heard, and the process worked. Obviously the first draft would have reduced access, but for anyone to think these changes were a deliberate back room plan to suppress voting rights was an insult to them, me, and the Council"

"It became clear very quickly that three was not the right number when this came out, and I think we could have worked together on a bipartisan proposal," the Mayor added.

State Senator Matt Lesser and 27th House District Rep Gary Turco, who held a recent press conference to voice their opposition to the 3-location proposal, say their concern was the potential effect.

"We shouldn't be surprised the initial proposal got the response it did. We heard

very clearly that threats to our voting system are of broad concern," Lesser said. "One thing you learn in politics it to take it at face value that motives are good, but you look at the effect, and the effect would have had a real impact on people's ability to cast a ballot. So, I'm grateful that the registrars are reconsidering."

Turco says the new options are an improvement – though he's leaning toward the first one, since it would retain all 7 polling locations

"I believe Marie when she says the intent wasn't to suppress voters, but the consequence would be making voting more difficult for every single Newington resident. My fear is if we didn't speak up, it would shortly become new policy in Newington, and the consequences would be voter suppression," Turco said. "I thank this Council and our Mayor for considering a revised proposal."

Other residents hope those considerations will include the registrar's proposal development process – and the data informing it.

Newington saw 83 percent of eligible voters cast a ballot in the 2020 Presidential – with 35 percent of votes submitted by mail – according to the Secretary of State's Office.

On January 24, Deputy Secretary of State Scott Bates sent a letter asking the registrars for, among other data, its turnout projections for 2022 – and the event that voters are not afforded the COVID excuse absentee eligibility that lapsed after the fall 2021 election season.

That letter was referring specifically to the previous 3-location proposal, but Avey and Fox have indicated that a more detailed report regarding the two alternatives – with mapping visuals – will be made public soon.

"I think that's a good starting point to be able to answer those questions to give transparency to the public as to the process," Weaver said.

Councilors Hail Mixed-Use Development on Berlin Turnpike

Town Councilors are hailing a record-setting developer investment as they prepare to entertain a 10-year, 50 percent tax abatement for the Berlin Turnpike-bound project – a combination of luxury apartments, a grocery store, and various retail amenities.

The mixed-use vision is called Meadow Commons, and it will see two developers – Grossman Group and Criterion Partners – pump a collective \$100 million into the 3333 Berlin Turnpike parcel currently owned by an Eversource subsidiary.

"This is the biggest announcement for private investment in the history of the town," said Town Manager Keith Chapman during the Council's January 25 meeting. "We've worked with the developers for several months to get it to this point. They're excited to come in, and we're equally excited that they've chosen Newington."

Minus soft costs, the investment comes to \$82 million – \$57.4 million of which is taxable.

That adds over \$2.2 million, annually, to the Grand List under normal conditions - \$1.1 million each year, for the next 10 years, if the Council approves the tax fixing agree-

ment proposed by Town Assessor Steve Kolofsky.

It will be the tenth in the town's history, which boasts 9 abatements – 6 of which were worth 100 percent, and 3 of which were for 50 percent.

"This is the most aggressive agreement we've brought to you in our tenure, but it's also the biggest development we've ever had, so the two sort of go hand in hand," Kolofsky told the Council. "It's a competitive situation where if one town isn't as aggressive, they'll go to the other town."

Grossman Group, a commercial developer, and Criterion Partners, a residential specialist, have been working hand in hand since Lakeway Commons, a similar project that saw success in Shrewsbury, Massachusetts.

Grossman will own and manage the 24-acre parcel's Berlin Turnpike-facing front lot – the future home an "anchor" grocery store and 35,000 square feet of lifestyle retail, dining, and amenity tenants to be spread out across five commercial buildings.

The back parcel, which Criterion will own and operate, is earmarked for 269 market-rate apartment units – served by a fitness center, indoor garden, and clubhouse – according to Town Planner Renata Bertotti.

The Town Planning and Zoning Commission has

cleared the project for construction.

"This tax fixing agreement is really the last hurdle," Chapman said. "We'll want to get it done in a timely fashion, because the developers are ready to get started."

The Council reconvenes February 8 and will likely vote on the abatement then. But at the January 25 meeting, the project got a warm reception.

"This is huge, and such an incredible project to bring to Newington," Mayor Beth DelBuono told Chapman and his Town Hall economic development team. "I'm really ecstatic and really appreciate your efforts on this."

Councilor Mitch Page echoed the sentiment.

"This looks like a great opportunity for the town," Page said. "It'll help us in many ways, looking at terrible budget crunches."

He just had one suggestion: to try and coordinate with the State DOT to ensure Meadow Commons' future residents have reliable bus route access.

"That's a large group of folks, and if we can encourage folks to use public transportation that would be an obvious benefit," Page said.

Farrar Announces Re-Election Bid for 20th District

Democratic State Representative Kate Farrar has announced her plans to seek a second term presiding over the 20th House District – which, per the recent legislative reapportionment, will include 8,000 Newington voters.

Farrar, whose District will encompass the southern part of West Hartford and the west end of Newington, was first elected in 2020 – she'll campaign to retain that seat this coming fall.

"In this time of uncertainty and immense challenges, I am running for re-election to continue to be a champion for our communities," Farrar wrote in a prepared statement sent to news outlets Monday. "I'm committed to work together to build a fair recovery out of this crisis for all of us to thrive"

For Farrar, a self-styled progressive, that means protecting and expanding child-care programs, making it easier for working mothers to return to the workforce and/or attaining training in high-earning careers, and removing roadblocks to affordable housing – challenges she sees as gender equity issues exacerbated by the pandemic.

"The pandemic's greatest economic impact has been on women, and it doesn't just impact them individually – it's felt throughout the community," Farrar said over the phone

Farrar, a UConn product, got her first taste of politics while interning for Denise Merrill in her capacity a House Rep – years before she became Secretary of State.

She says that experience inspired her to pursue a career in the nonprofit sector, where she's spent the last 20 years.

Farrar's nonprofit work has included providing women and girls with STEM education opportunities, lobbying for paid family medical leave legislation. She currently serves as the Program Specialist for Connecticut Food Share.

Farrar says it's those experiences that informed her decision to run two years ago.

"Doing that job in the nonprofit sector, I saw so many gaps for families and senior struggling to make ends meet," Farrar said. "I've been encouraging other women to run for years, and I decided to take my own ad-

In her first term, Farrar advocated for the Crown Act, which prohibits employers from banning hairstyles synonymous with African American culture – a practice advocates say is rooted in racial discrimination.

She also worked to pass pay transparency legislation and expanded the state's Care for Kids childcare subsidy program to make those pursuing workforce training and education eligible.

Farrar says her priorities for this coming legislative session will include establishing a Connecticut child tax credit and retaining the earned income tax credit passed last year.

The latter was among several proposals Farrar and progressive lawmakers had put into a larger tax restructuring plan – and Farrar says she expects that conversation to continue.

"The story of our state is we do have a great inequality gap. Much of that can be tied to our tax system," she said. "If you see that our lower and middle-income families are paying 2-3 times the amount of the wealthiest, that just doesn't seem right."

At the local level, she's got her sights set on transit-oriented development – West Hartford and Newington are both looking to add rail stops to the New Haven-to-Springfield line.

"We can have a collaborative approach in how we look at our towns," she said. "We want people to see a future for living in these communities, and that transportation investment is really crucial."

Dear Editor.



Bello to Seek Second Term for 28h House District

Democratic State Representative Amy Morrin Bello will be seeking a second term presiding over Wethersfield's 28th House District.

Morrin Bello, a former Wethersfield Mayor elected to the seat in 2020, made the announcement in a statement released to news outlets this past Monday.

"I would be honored to continue to serve the people of Wethersfield. As your representative, I've dedicated myself to listening to my constituents and representing our entire community," Morrin Bello wrote. "I'm proud of my record of fighting for our families' health and safety during the pandemic, championing voting rights, and working to pass laws to assist our workforce and grow our economy. With your support, I will continue to advocate for these important initiatives at the State level and bring crucial funding back to our town."

Morrin Bello, a former Wethersfield Town Clerk, served on the Town Council from 2015 to 2020 – holding the Mayor's seat from 2017-2019. She petitioned for, and won, the town's

first Democratic primary to secure her place on the November 2020 ballot – a race for the 28th House seat vacated by longtime Democratic State Rep Russ Morin. "I'm incredibly impressed with the way Amy delivers for Wethersfield," Morin wrote in the statement. "She's responsive to her constituents, worked to protect our families and businesses during the pandemic and fought to protect voting rights. I'm proud to support her for re-election in November."

Morrin Bello serves on the legislative General Administration and Elections Committee – a charge that saw her deliberate on, and support, the pandemic-driven expansion of vote-by-mail eligibility in 2020.

On the Transportation Committee, Bello advocated for infrastructure investment, as well as pedestrian and bike-friendly roads – of particular concern to many residents

and visitors of the town's Old Wethersfield historic district.

Wethersfield captured \$11.9 million in municipal aid through the 2021 bipartisan biennial state budget – and the number climbs to \$12.4 million in 2022.

Kidnapping Suspect Arrested

Jewish Genealogical Society

Women and STEM

The number of women entering the professional fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) is slowly growing around the world, but there is still a sizable gender gap in these professions. According to the College Board, which produces many standardized tests, only 27 percent of all students taking the AP Computer Science exam in the United Science are women. Similarly, just 18 percent of American computer-science degrees are attained by females. However, this is not the case elsewhere in the world. A paper by Gijsbert Stoet and David Geary published in Psychological Science noted that women who live in countries with traditionally higher gender inequality tend to choose STEM professions more readily. Algeria, for example, has one of the highest ratios of women in STEM professions, at 41 percent. Stoet and Geary surmise that women in these countries may be choosing careers with the strongest path to financial independence.

According to a U.S. Department of Education report, students studying science or math in college have a higher employment rate and salary than other majors after graduation. STEM majors typically earn an average of \$15,500 more annually than non-STEM majors. Engineering and engineering technology tends to pay the most. Women eager to secure competitive, stable and well-paying jobs should carefully consider the opportunities available to them in STEM fields.



ADOPT A SHELTER PET

FELINE LEUKEMIA VIRUS (FeLV) is a virus that attacks the immune system of a cat. It is not a form of cancer, but a retrovirus that affects the immune system. About 70% of cats who encounter the virus are able to resist infection and eliminate the virus on their own. The cats that don't eliminate the virus will test positive for the antigens. Feline leukemia is a disease that only affects cats -- it cannot be transmitted to people, dogs, or other animals. FeLV is passed from one cat to another through saliva, blood, and to some extent, urine and feces. The virus does not live long outside the cat's body. Only 3% of house cats test positive for FeLV. Keeping your cat indoors and away from infected cats is a sure way to prevent them from contracting FeLV. Cats with FeLV can live normal, happy, healthy lives, though they may have a shorter life expectancy. Their immune system is compromised and anemia and lymphoma may develop. Historically, cats with this diséase have been euthanized as soon as they are diagnosed. But, most rescue groups now believe that these cats are equally deserving of adoption, love, and care and should be humanely euthanized when the disease shows dominance over their immune systems. 

Eagles Basketball Falls to NWC, Rebound on the Road

Northwest Catholic used a 16-0 run in the first quarter to take an early lead and never looked back as the visiting Lions defeated Wethersfield girls' basketball 58-44 last Tuesday, Jan. 25 at WHS.

NWC seniors Morgan Murphy (23 points) and Brianna Lebrun (19) did a majority of the scoring damage. The duo combined to score all 25 of the team's first quarters points.

"What has frustrated me to this point is that we are usually able to take away a team's best player, but it's been the opposite against us this year," said Wethersfield head coach Jeff Russell. His goal is to have the team play disciplined defensively and hopefully create easy buckets on the offensive end.

Following the loss to NWC, the Eagles responded with back-to-back road games against Berlin and Rockville, bringing their record to 7-5.

Defense was the catalyst in the wins, holding the teams to 28 and 29 points respectively. Venditti combined for 24 points in the two wins, including going 4-4 from behind the arc in the win over Rockville.

The Eagles return to WHS this Friday, Feb. 4, for an important Central Connecticut Conference tilt with Middletown. The game tips at 6:45 p.m.


